REDD+ in Bhutan

Conservation of forests is of paramount importance to safeguard the country from natural disasters, sustain the livelihood of the population and revenue generation through hydroelectricity.

REDD+ mechanism will complement efforts of RGOB and its people in conserving its forest resources and meet the commitment of ensuring 60% forest coverage as enshrined in the constitution of Bhutan besides enhancing livelihood of the local communities

The role of local communities in REDD+

Local communities play an important role in conservation by upholding the traditional beliefs, practicing traditional farming systems, participating in decision making & implementation of the decision & policies that reflect their needs.
